Early Career Liaison program

We received two applications for the Early Career Liaison program. Jeanelle Uy (Assistant Professor, CalState University, Long Beach) was chosen as our new Early Career Liaison. In her application, Professor Uy focused on the struggle of adjunct and other contingent faculty positions in finding stable work, as well as their vulnerability during the current economic crisis. She proposed forming a panel or ad hoc committee of members at various career stages to discuss strategies, experiences and concerns about (1) getting into a tenure line position; and (2) navigating a non-academic job search. Ultimately she hopes to develop tangible resources she would make available to members in these unstable positions. Professor Uy will shadow the Chair of the Committee on Career Development, Shara Bailey, and work with the Student Programs committee to disseminate relevant information to graduate students. We wish her the best during her appointment as the AAPA Early Career Liaison, and we thank Michele Beasley for her service as outgoing Early Career Liaison.

Cobb Professional Development Grants (CPDG)

The AAPA CPDG committee reviewed 22 eligible applications in 2020-2021. As in the past, we received several applications from outside of the USA and many projects involved international work and collaborations. Overall, the pool of applications was strong, representing the scholarly breadth of AAPA. Each application was reviewed by three committee members and the Chair. In reviewing proposals, the committee considered the significance of the work, the quality of the proposal, the potential impact of the award on the applicant's career (including career stage and access to other funding sources) and the strength of the recommendation letter and CV. The committee recommended funding six proposals, up to \$7500 each. Award and declination letters were emailed to applicants on March 8, 2021. The award recipients are as follows:
