Dear Members.

In the last week, over 400 NSF grants have been terminated and other funds are also frozen. Your help is urgently needed to support NSF and government support of science generally. Please help make it clear why NSF is crucial to the security, prosperity, and health of the United States. Many people remain unaware of NSF's historic role in establishing the US' leadership in science and innovation, which in turn has far-ranging benefits for all Americans.

We ask your help to do the following:

ONE: Contact your representatives in Congress

If you are not sure who your representatives are, please go to https://www.govtrack.us/congress/members/map and enter your address. When you reach out, the recommendation is to focus on one issue, keep it brief, personalize the call/letter (noting that you are a constituent), and being courteous but firm. If your representative's phone number is not listed online, you can dial the U.S. Capitol Switchboard at (202) 224-3121 to ask to be connected to your Senators and Representative

It is also preferable NOT to send a form email/letter (many suggest it is best to call), and it is best NOT to use your institutional email.
